

ANNA MARSHALL BURSARY



Anna Mae Marshall (nee Mason) was a 1963 graduate of Hampton High School, who upon graduation entered the Saint John General Hospital School of Nursing. Anna received her RN designation in 1966. For those who have known Anna, we believe it can be stated that Anna's professional career and personal life can best be described as kindness personified. Anna recognized that many of the programs set in place to assist students in post-secondary education were judged based on scholastic achievement more so than financial need. Accordingly, the Anna Marshall bursary is an attempt to provide an ambitious, hard-working student, who has put his or her self in a position to be accepted for post-secondary education with assistance in non-tuition related expenses.

- Awarded to a graduating student attending Hampton High School
- A onetime amount of \$5,000 for each of a male and female student planning to attend a fully accredited post-secondary institution in the fall of his/her graduating year.
- Bursary to be paid upon formal acceptance and confirmation of attendance at the post-secondary institution
- Post-secondary institutions include, but not limited to: Trade Schools, Technical Schools, Community College, Paramedic Schools, Holland College and Universities.
- If either successful candidate, for whatever reason, fails to enroll and attend, the Bursary will be awarded to next candidate.

The application will be in the form of a one page statement titled "Anna Marshall Bursary" and providing details confirming the following;

1. Need as a result of personal or economic hardship currently or previously suffered by the applicant's family unit
2. Extracurricular activities, clubs, athletics, if any
3. Volunteer work, if any
4. Type of secondary education being pursued
